Choose simple wooden puzzles with lots of colours.</p>	<p><b>9</b></p> <p>Make a <b>Job Chart!</b> Use pictures of simple jobs your child can do around the house: Cleaning up- cut out a picture of toys in a toy box.</p>	<p><b>10</b></p> <p>Cut out <b>pictures</b> of animals Group animals by size, where they live or how they move.</p>	<p><b>11</b></p> <p><b>Remembrance Day</b></p> 	<p><b>12</b></p> <p><b>Write</b> down words that your child likes. Have him/her draw a picture next to it: dinosaur/puzzle/game</p>	<p><b>13</b></p> <p>Pick a <b>book</b> your child knows by heart. Let your child tell you the story.</p>	<p><b>14</b></p>
<p><b>15</b></p> <p><b>Practice</b> a sound that your child is having difficulty saying.</p>	<p><b>16</b></p> <p>Go on a <b>colour hunt</b> together. How many things can you find that are red /blue/green in 5 minutes?</p>	<p><b>17</b></p> <p>Take a <b>walk</b> together and talk about the way things around you are the same and different.</p>	<p><b>18</b></p> <p>Play a <b>game</b> together like Memory or Bingo</p>	<p><b>19</b></p> <p><b>Ask</b> your child what he/she did today.</p>	<p><b>20</b></p> <p>Make some <b>music</b>.
